Dear Residents.

It is hard to believe that I have been at Wauconda Park District for 20 years! We have seen a lot of changes to our programs and services during this time. It is my vision that we will continue to grow, exploring new options for you to recreate.

Program Guide – Beginning with this issue of the program guide, you may notice that we are changing when we publish the spring season of our guide series. Moving forward we will offer a Winter guide, Spring/ Summer guide, and a Fall guide. Staff felt it was important to make this change to provide summer programming information earlier, so that you can work out your schedules in advance.

Comprehensive Plan – We continue to plot our future by developing a Comprehensive Plan. I want to thank everyone who took time to complete our statistically valid survey. We are reviewing the results of this survey and look forward to meeting your needs. In January, we will publish an open survey on our website www.waucondaparks.com. This will give residents, nonresidents, and all park users an opportunity to provide feedback on our District.

In December, our Board, Staff, and Management team will hold workshops to discuss what we envision the District to look like down the road. Also, in January, we will hold similar workshops with key stakeholders in the community and different homeowner groups. Please keep an eye on our Facebook page and website for further updates on these workshops.

OSLAD Grant – In September, the District completed an OSLAD grant through the State of Illinois for renovations at Osage Park, including tennis courts, pickleball courts, basketball court, and Futsal court. The grant approval process takes some time, and the District expects to hear back from the State in December or January. If the District does not receive this grant, staff will continue to explore different revenue streams to assist in these improvements.

Winter Program Highlights – The Recreation staff has been busy planning a fun-filled winter for you. Parents need a night out with or without the kids. Check out our family friendly special events on page 8 including Mom and Son Bowling, Sweetheart Dance, Parents Night out, and Sunday Funday. 



Creative Dance

Creative Dance blends movement, music, improvisation, and basic dance steps while providing an excellent introduction for the future study of all dance techniques. Students learn dance fundamentals while improving motor skills, self-expression, confidence, imagination and social development. Dancer must be fully potty trained, no pull-ups. This is a drop off class.

Pre-Ballet / Pre-Ballet and Tap

This program takes the basics of ballet technique combined with props and imagination and gives the children a fun and educational class. Large motor skills are highlighted as well as stimulating the brain's coordination. Pre-Ballet and Tap classes also explore rhythms and smaller motor skill. This is a drop off class.

Pre-Jazz

Jazz is a funkier form of dance. This is an introductory class with jazz basics to fun and kid-friendly music. Dancers will learn the beginning steps of jazz and work on picking up choreography sequences that fuse style and technique. This is a drop off class.

Pre-Modern

Modern Dance explores movement, space, rhythm and the dancer's own creativity with emphasis on momentum, shapes and patterns. It is inspired by nature, music, art and emotions. This class will contain a basic technique study and improvisation. This is a drop off class.

Ballet

As students grow, they naturally begin to dance as a form of expression and imagination. We capture this enthusiasm and incorporate it into our ballet program - emphasizing proper ballet technique with a focus on developing strength, alignment, musicality, and the grace that is inherent in the form. As students mature and their bodies develop strength, we transition to a more serious study of ballet technique that will prepare them to be both confident and technically proficient artists.

Hip Hop

Hip-Hop evolved out of street and break dancing and is characterized by its athletic and bouncy style. Hip-Hop is set to a strong, contemporary beat, builds stamina, and emphasizes body isolations, attitude, coordination, freestyle movement, and rhythm. This form of dance is seen in music videos.

Jazz

Jazz dance is an upbeat and performative style that is often seen in Broadway productions. While exploring many different stylistic preferences, students focus on principles such as syncopated rhythms, body isolations, precise technical skills, and choreography. Students will be exposed to various styles of jazz such as Broadway, Street and Contemporary to help develop a well-rounded dancer.

Lyrical

Lyrical is a fusion of ballet and jazz dance techniques. Lyrical dance challenges dancers to use motion to interpret music and express emotion. Lyrical jazz is a very passionate and emotional dance style. It portrays certain emotions and tells a story through every movement made.

Modern

Modern Dance develops strong creative dancers through the study of technique and improvisation with a focus on musicality, dynamics, floor-work and artistic expression. The class will provide students with the opportunity to create their own explorative movement within a structured class.

Musical Theatre

This class will focus on the execution of dance as a method of storytelling. In musical theatre, characters sing when emotion becomes too strong to speak and they dance when they are even further transported. This class will focus on Broadway style jazz. Students will enjoy music, singing and choreography inspired by various musical productions and will be encouraged to sing along!!

Tap

Tap focuses on developing coordination, precision, rhythmic skills, and musicality within both the Broadway and contemporary Rhythm-Tap styles. As students progress they further develop skills, focusing on clarity of sounds and increasing speed as well as dynamics and musicality.

Leaps and Turns

Leaps and Turns is a technique class designed to improve the overall ability of the students. Students will focus on conditioning, working to increase strength, extension, flexibility as well as turns with more precision and various leaps. This class is appropriate for students currently enrolled in dance classes, dance team and cheer.



Welcome to As We Grow Preschool. Our program emphasizes socialization and learning through play. This enables your child's social, emotional, and creative development to ensure his/her own unique potential.

Our preschool environment allows your child to explore in a room filled with warmth, affection, and respect for others. Friendship, sharing, and cooperation are modeled and practiced daily.

Eligibility

Children must be the proper age as of September 1 (December 1 for Pre-K). Children must be toilet trained if enrolled in the 3, 4, or Pre-K program.

Our preschool runs from September through late May. You will receive a calendar with the handbook in August.

Payment and Refund Policy

Tuition payments are monthly and are based on a yearly fee broken into nine equal monthly payments. The registration fee, which holds your spot, is equal to one month's tuition and is used to pay the May tuition. No refunds are given for the registration payment should you withdraw from the program. All payments are due on the first of each month, beginning September 1. Tuition payments not received by the seventh of the month will incur a \$15 late fee. Enrollment in the automatic payment program is highly encouraged.





EFT form must be filled out completely, including credit card, debit card, or bank account number in order to purchase the monthly membership.



4 EASY WAYS TO REGISTER



1- In Person

Come to the Wauconda Park District located at 600 N Main Street during office hours (located on page 3) and we will guide you through the registration process. Please bring payment with you: cash, check, or Visa/Mastercard/Discover Card/American Express. If a class is full, we can help you find another or put you on a waiting list. After hours, you can leave registration forms or payment in our night time drop box, located in the Community Center circle.



2- By Mail

Pick up or download our registration form, fill out completely, sign waiver on the back, include payment, and mail to us-600 N Main Street, Wauconda, IL 60084. If we receive your registration before the registration dates that apply to you, we will hold until the proper time. If a class is full, we will call you with options.



3- By Fax

Pick up or download our registration form, fill out completely, including the waiver on the back. Be sure to include all program information and a credit/debit card number with an expiration date. Fax both sides of the form to (847) 526-3791 anytime of day. If a class is full or we do not have all the information that is necessary, we will call you.



4- Online

Visit our website at www.waucondaparks.com and go to the registration page. You can register for programs using our secure server and a credit card. Be sure to see all the other great Park District information and updates that are available to you on this site. You can e-mail us with any questions by clicking the contact us tab on our website, and we will return your inquiry.

Satisfaction Guarantee/Refunds

The Wauconda Park District is constantly striving to offer you the best in recreation activities, events, and programs. If you are not completely satisfied, please tell us and we will arrange one of the following:

- You may transfer to another class if space is available or have the fee left as a class credit for future use.
- · A pro-rated refund will be provided if requested prior to the third class meeting.
- Upon proof, a pro-rated refund will be given for medical reasons or moving out of town.
- All refunds are subject to a \$5 service charge.
- Refunds are not given for facility passes, leagues, trips, special events, club, preschool, or summer day camp.
- Refunds can take up to three weeks to process and are mailed by check, credit back to your credit card, or class credit.
- A pro-rated class credit will be processed for contractual class requests up to the third meeting.
- Participants registered for classes that are cancelled due to low enrollment will be issued a class credit for future use. Participants must request a refund if they would like their class credit refunded.
- Refund requests must be submitted a minimum of five days before the start of a class session in order to receive a full refund minus the \$5 service charge. Refund requests made four days or less before a class starts will be refunded at 50% of the class cost less a \$5 service charge.

Waiver

The Wauconda Park District is committed to conducting its recreation programs in a safe manner and holds the safety of participants in high regard. The Wauconda Park District continually strives to reduce such risks and insists that all participants follow safety rules and instructions that are designed to protect the participants' safety. However, participants and parents/guardians of minors registering for this program/activity must recognize that there is an inherent risk of injury when choosing to participate in recreational activities. You are solely responsible for determining if you or your minor child/ward are physically fit and/or skilled for the activities contemplated by this agreement. It is always advisable, especially if the participant is pregnant, disabled in any way or recently suffered an illness, injury, or impairment, to consult a physician before undertaking any physical activity.

Warning of Risk

Despite careful and proper preparation, instruction, medical advice, conditioning and equipment, there is still a risk of serious injury when participating in any recreational activity/program. Understandably, not all hazards and dangers can be foreseen. Participants must understand that certain risks, dangers, and injuries due to acts of god, inclement weather, slipping, falling, equipment failure, failure in supervision, premises defects, and all other circumstances inherent to recreational activities/programs exist. In this regard, it must be recognized that it is impossible for the Wauconda Park District to guarantee absolute safety.

Waiver and Release of all Claims and Assumptions of Risk

Please read this form carefully and be aware that in signing up and participating in this program/activity, you will be expressly assuming the risk and legal liability and waiving and releasing all claims for injuries, damages, or loss which you or your minor child/ward might sustain as a result of participating in any and all activities connected with and associated with this program/activity (including transportation services, when provided.)

I recognize and acknowledge that there are certain risks of physical injury to participants in this program/activity, and I voluntarily agree to assume the full risk of any and all injuries, damages or loss, regardless of severity, that my minor child/ward or I may sustain as a result of said participation. I further agree to waive and relinquish all claims I or my minor child/ward may have (or accrue to me or my child/ward) as a result of participating in this program/activity against the Wauconda Park District, including its officials, agents, volunteers, and employees (hereinafter collectively referred as "Wauconda Park District".)

I do hereby fully release and forever discharge the Wauconda Park District from any and all claims for injuries, damages, or loss that my minor child/ward or I may

have or which may accrue to me or my minor child/ward and arising out of, connected with, or in any way associated with this program/activity.

I have read and fully understand the above important information, warning of risk, assumption of risk, and waiver and release of all claims. If registering a minor participant, I further attest that I have read the above to my minor child/ward.



Pet Policy

Pets are welcome in our parks, however for safety reasons, some areas are not acceptable for them. Pets are not allowed during any special event in which there is a high concentration of people in a confined area. Pets are also not allowed on any play field area. These areas include bleachers, or spectator areas, soccer, baseball, softball fields, dugout areas, court areas, or playgrounds. Pet owners are required to keep their pets on a 6' leash at all times, and remove pet droppings. Please kindly understand and respect this policy. Ordinance 2.04.



Photo/Privacy Policy

The Wauconda Park District uses photographs of participants in programs and special events to inform others about the recreational opportunities available in our community. We do not use identification in our brochure without prior consent. If you do not wish to have your picture taken, please inform the photographer. All personal information given to us through registration will be kept confidential. At no time will the WPD give, sell, or release personal information without your prior consent.



Notice to Parents- Drop Off and Pick Up

Attention parents—it is your responsibility to walk your minor child to and from class. Dropping kids off in front of our building is considered a safety issue. If a child is left unattended after a class or activity for a long period of time, we will call the police.



Class Schedules

All classes listed in the brochure have dates that detail when the class will meet. If a class is missed during the scheduled session for instructor illness or other conflict, a "make-up" class will be added to the end of the session or a class will be extended. A note or a call from the park district, or a class announcement will communicate that change to you. We are only closed for major holidays. Again, please refer to the class schedule or call as we do NOT follow the school's schedule for all classes.



Residency

To qualify as a resident, you must reside within the village. Households located in unincorporated Wauconda are considered NON-RESIDENT. If you are unsure, you can check your property tax bill to see what park district you pay taxes to. PROOF OF RESIDENCY MAY BE REQUIRED.



ADA/NISRA

The Wauconda Park District complies with the Americans for Disabilities Act. Persons with special needs are encouraged to contact the Park District regarding accommodations to our programs. You may also contact NISRA at (815) 459-0737, who can assist you with the programs and services they offer. Wauconda Park District is a proud member of NISRA, who offers a full-line of community programs from infants to seniors-and Special Olympics.



Safety/Waiver/Insurance


The Wauconda Park District is currently a member of PDRMA—a risk management pool made up of 154+ area park districts. Through their directives and guidance we are constantly striving to make your park district the safest it can be. For liability purposes the Wauconda Park District requires an adult to sign a waiver before participation can begin. The Wauconda Park District provides NO insurance for any injury or damage that may occur. We strongly recommend that you check with your insurance carrier.

Behavior Policy

To ensure safe and enjoyable programs, activities, and facilities for all residents, the Wauconda Park District has developed the following Code of Conduct. Participants are expected to exhibit appropriate behavior at all times when involved in Park District programs, activities, events, leagues, and while using the Park District Facilities and Parks.

- 1. Show respect to all participants and staff.
- 2. Refrain from using foul or obscene language.
- 3. Refrain from causing bodily harm to participants and staff.
- 4. Refrain from communicating threats, inappropriate comments, or actions that can be considered as any type of harassment, direct threat or actions that pose a threat by gesture, words, or actions.
- 5. Exhibit tolerance and courtesies and commonly accepted behavior towards our diverse community.
- 6. Show respect to equipment, supplies, and facilities.
- 7. Exhibit good sportsmanship at athletic events whether an active participant or observer.
- 8. The use, suspected use, or consumption of alcohol or illegal substances on Park District property is prohibited. While alcohol is approved for select special and off property events, it is expected that all residents and participants will exhibit good judgment and moderation when alcohol is consumed.

The Wauconda Park District reserves the right to dismiss without refund any participant who violates the behavior policy. In addition, if it is felt that such actions pose a threat to the general safety or welfare of other participants, an individual or group may risk consequences associated with the summoning of the Wauconda Police.
